Essential Components of a Secondary Lesson Plan

The Workshop Model 90 minute block schedule

- Warm-up/Bell work 5-8 minutes
- Mini-lesson 15-20 minutes
- Work session/period 40-45 minutes
- Closing 15 minutes

Warm-up/Bell work

(5-8 minutes)

- An activity designed to engage students at the beginning of class.
- It can be used to
 - reflect on previous learning,
 - cultivate curiosity about new content,
 - activate prior knowledge, or
 - provide a smooth transition into the day's lesson.

Mini-lesson

(15-20 minutes)

- Teacher directed whole group lesson that prepares students for the work period.
- Standards based instruction that frequently focuses on
 - procedures,
 - skills,
 - strategies, or
 - demonstration.

Work session/period

(40-45 minutes)

- A time students are utilizing information from the mini-lesson.
- Student work during this time reflects what is/has been taught in the mini-lesson.
 - Guided Practice
 - Independent Practice
 - Cooperative Learning
 - Small Group Instruction
 - Conferencing

Closing


(15 minutes)

■ An activity designed to refocus and tie the components of the lesson together for the students.



- Teachers can use the closing to:
 - Allow students to share learning/work
 - Check for student feedback
 - Clarify misconceptions

KUD



Knows – Facts, names, dates, places, information

- The original inhabitants of the Americas migrated from Asian into North America over the Bering land bridge.
- The multiplication tables.

<u>Understands</u> – Essential truths that give meaning to the topic; ideas that transfer across situations. Can be phrased "Students should understand THAT..."

- migration enables organisms to meet basic needs.
- multiplication is another way to do addition.

Dos – Skills (basic skills, skills of the discipline, skills of independence, social skills, skills of production); usually verb phrases.

- Trace and explain the migratory path of the original Americans.
- Use multiplication to solve story problems.
- Work collaboratively in a group to complete an assigned task.
