An Olympic Star

Jesse Owens was born in the American South in 1913. In 1936, he was a big star at the Summer Olympic Games in Germany. He won four gold medals as a member of the American track team. He raced to victory in the 100- and 200-meter dashes. He was part of the winning 400-meter relay team. In the jumping contest, he flew almost 27 feet. His victories upset Hitler, the leader of Germany. Hitler wanted to show that the German people were the best at sports. 
